Dear Friends,

There are more little footsteps echoing through the halls of Neve Michael, each belonging to a child who has lost the safety of home.

Three young siblings recently came to Neve Michael Children's Emergency Crisis Center. Their father is in prison for sexually abusing them. Their mother is lying in a hospital bed, too ill to care for them. They arrived with no suitcase, no toys - only each other. The oldest clutched the hands of the younger two, trying to be brave, trying to be the "grown-up," when in truth he is just a child himself.

Now, two tiny twins have arrived. Their mother is gravely ill, their home is unsafe, and there is no father to turn to. These very young children crossed our threshold having seen more pain in their short lives than most adults ever will. Here, they will finally be held, fed, and told that they are safe. It will take everything we have to give them that chance.

Everything is harder now. The war has cut us off from many visitors who brought comfort and joy. Many of our dedicated staff, our lifeline, have been called up for military service.

As you know, for the children who arrive at Neve Michael Children's Village, the journey begins in the shadows of trauma. They come from homes marked by abuse, neglect, violence, or abandonment, carrying the invisible wounds of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Nightmares, hypervigilance, and emotional outbursts are not simply "behavioral issues" here; they are the echoes of a painful past. Since October 7, Neve Michael promptly implemented additional, unbudgeted therapeutic services and tutoring sessions to address urgent needs and provide essential support.

The recent wars in Israel have made these wounds ache all over again. The sounds of sirens, the thud of distant explosions, and the separation from loved ones have triggered memories that our children work so hard to leave behind. For a child already scared by fear and instability, such moments reopen old injuries, making healing even harder. Yet, even in these dark times, there is light. We sincerely appreciate your steadfast support and trust in our mission. Your partnership enables us to create lasting changes in the lives of these extraordinary children.

Each day at Neve Michael, we face growing and heartbreaking challenges, additional children and younger children arriving, constant missile threats, and the deep trauma of children at risk. Through it all, your unwavering support has been a lifeline.

As we welcome the New Year, my heart is filled with gratitude for your unwavering support and kindness. Here at Neve Michael, we see every day how your generosity changes lives - giving our children safety, hope, and the chance to dream again.

Even amidst recent ongoing events, enduring life-threatening missiles from Hamas, Hezbollah, Iran and Houthis, we stand united, shoulder to shoulder as a family and as a beacon of resilience. We have faced hardships before and emerged stronger, guided by the same courage and determination that have defined the lives of Neve Michael's children at risk.

Rosh Hashana is a time of reflection and renewal, and thanks to you, we are entering this season with faith in brighter days ahead for every child in our care. May this year bring you and your loved ones good health, joy, and abundant blessings.

Together, let us continue to pray for the swift and safe return of all of our hostages and the protection of our brave soldiers.
